Laura Ingram Scholarship

Awarded to the Year 8 student who attains the highest aggregate mark in the annual Laura Ingram Scholarship exams. This academic scholarship is open to all Year 8 students. In accordance with the Laura Ingram Trust, the exams are set, supervised and marked by the Principal (or nominee). Brian Bailey will be the examiner again this year and he has kindly offered to provide candidates with extra tuition through the year leading to the final exams. Some of the topics will be taught and examined during the year, and these papers will be marked and returned to the candidates for discussion. This is great preparation for High School. Students intending to enter this programme need to have good self-management and study skills. They need to spend the year listening carefully to their teachers and questioning when they do not understand.
